About Our Rebrand

We're excited to share that Empower Her Network became Empowered Network in May 2024 to better reflect those we serve and embody their incredible resiliency. Our new name and visual identity encapsulate strength and forward movementqualities we associate with the community. Although our outward appearance has changed, the work we are doing has not. Empowered Network will continue to support survivors with the resources they need to achieve economic freedom.

To our donors and partners –

Since its inception, Empowered Network has sought to expand philanthropic support surrounding the services available to trafficking survivors.

The prevailing paradigm is that assistance ends as soon as a survivor achieves basic stability. But economic and social societal barriers remain that prevent survivors from pursuing their dreams. When these systemic issues are addressed, however, survivors become their own solution. Empowered Network's innovative approach demonstrates the enormous, innate potential within the survivor community once these barriers – which shouldn't be there in the first place – are removed.

The work we've accomplished together shows what's possible when survivors are in the driver's seat. We want to take this opportunity to express our gratitude: We deeply appreciate you – you are an instrumental part of our network. Thank you for allowing us to empower survivors and making the work we do possible.

Empowered Network continues to operate beyond the moment of crisis to provide guidance and resources that empower survivors to determine their own futures. Through an "Empowerment Plan" that spans 12 to 18 months, trauma-informed advocates in 11 human trafficking hubs collaborate with program participants on reaching financial independence. We are incredibly proud of what Empowered Network achieved in 2023 thanks to the hard work of survivors in the program, our engaged staff, and your generous support.

As of the new year, the network consists of 345 survivors, including 203 alumni. Your contributions have not only supported these resilient individuals but also their families. Every survivor who achieves fiscal independence is in a much better position to protect their children, ending generational cycles of poverty and exploitation.

Our goal is to reach 200 total Empowerment Plans in 2024. With an average wage increase of \$9,863, reaching this benchmark will bring survivors \$1,972,600 in new wages within 18 months. It will also allow 300 children currently at high risk to benefit from stable housing in above-poverty-line households. But we cannot do this without you. Join us in making this goal a reality and positioning survivors to achieve their dreams.

Together, survivors and their allies can flip the script and empower a once overlooked community to thrive.

HEAR IT STRAIGHT FROM SURVIVORS

While the network covers expenses surrounding housing, education, and employment – which often act as a barrier to independence – what program alumni remember most is the power of having someone in their corner.

"[Empowered Network] taught me to not be afraid to give up the good to go for the great, and if the old me could see this version of herself, she'd know there is a life outside of being trafficked and it's beautiful. I am now in my first ever fulltime position as a program coordinator for a human trafficking organization."

Did you know?

At least 80% of survivors who do not receive resources specific to human trafficking and long-term support after the moment of crisis are revictimized by traffickers. A 2023 study showed that 83% of survivors had experienced poverty, 40% had a criminal history because of their trafficking experience, and 60% experienced financial abuse by their trafficker. All of which make it extremely difficult to establish a career and secure stable housing. Empowered Network is proud to step in at this critical juncture to provide tactical funding and personalized guidance so survivors and their families can exit the cycle of exploitation and poverty for good.

WHO WE SERVED

Did you know?

More than 49 million people worldwide are estimated to be caught in the cycle of human trafficking or living in modernday slavery. This includes up to 1,091,000 individuals in the United States. Among them, the overwhelming majority are women of color. A two-year study of suspected human trafficking incidents across the country revealed that 94% of sex trafficking survivors were female, 40% were Black, and 24% were Latinx.⁵

2023 BY THE NUMBERS

Empowered Network grew 24% in 2023, which allowed us to serve more survivors than ever before, enabling long-term outcomes that lead to economic freedom.



ABOUT OUR SURVIVOR-CENTERED **APPROACH**

Several of Empowered Network's Advocates have lived experience (including some as EN alumni!) and help inform our messaging and approach. In addition, there are currently two voting board members who are survivor-leaders: CEO of Runaway Girl, Carissa Phelps, and CEO of Ending the Game, Rachel Thomas.

Members, as EN calls active program participants, are in the driver's seat of their Empowerment Plan. They develop their own program with advocate guidance, and EN walks alongside them as it's implemented. For many, it's their first empowering experience.

EN meets the member where they are and looks to them to tell EN where they are headed.

The Empowerment Plan is written with the member, not for them. When it's ready, the advocate and member both sign it, establishing accountability on both ends.

The results of all collected metrics are shared openly.

When members graduate, they can opt-in to the Alumni Network, which provides group programming around financial wellness, career mobility, and continued community support.
